RESOLUTION NO. 18- (10)

of the

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe, its members, its lands, its enterprises and its agencies by the authority of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965;

WHEREAS, under the Constitution, Bylaws and inherent sovereignty of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of the tribal members, and with protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources and rights of the Tribe;

WHEREAS, The Tribe is a federally-recognized Indian Tribe possessing reserved powers, including the powers of self government;

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the creation of ordinances and resolutions in order to fulfill their duty of protecting the health, security, education, and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources of the Tribe;

WHEREAS, The Tribe's water supply comes from Skookum Valley groundwater, and that groundwater is connected to Skookum Creek;

WHEREAS, Skookum Valley groundwater is a limited resource;

WHEREAS, the Tribe has developed Water Conservation Guidelines to protect groundwater and Skookum Creek surface water;

WHEREAS, active water conservation by users of the Tribe's water supply protects groundwater and Skookum Creek from depletion;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council establishes the attached Water Conservation Guidelines for residences, businesses and government facilities that use the Tribe's water supply.

CERTIFICATION

The Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby certify that the foregoing Resolution was adopted at the regular meeting of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council, held on this $\frac{9}{2}$ day of $\frac{200}{200}$ at which time a quorum was present and was passed by a vote of $\frac{5}{200}$ for and $\frac{5}{200}$ against with $\frac{5}{200}$ abstentions.




Figure 3. Production Well #1 also has a monitoring well adjacent to it.
