


### **SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBE**



#### **RESOLUTION NO. 21-67**

#### of the

#### SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

**WHEREAS**, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe, its members, its lands, its enterprises and its agencies by the authority of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

**WHEREAS**, under the Constitution, Bylaws and inherent sovereignty of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources and rights of the Tribe; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribe is a federally-recognized Indian Tribe possessing reserved powers, including the powers of self-government; and

**WHEREAS**, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the creation of ordinances and resolutions in order to fulfill their duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources of the Tribe; and

**WHEREAS**, the Squaxin Island Tribe is operating under a continuing state of disaster and state of emergency as a result of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, guidance from the Department of Treasury states that ARPA relief funds received by the Tribe may disbursed to individual Tribal members in response to negative economic impacts caused by the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council has determined that there remains widespread unmet need among Tribal members who have suffered negative economic impacts due to the COVID-19 pandemic and that the fund authorized by this Resolution is a necessary expenditure, for the promotion of the general welfare, not lavish or extravagant, and not compensation for services.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Tribal Council directs a one-time distribution of up to one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1500) be made to adult members of Squaxin Island Tribe for reasonable and necessary personal, family, living, or funeral expenses incurred as a result

of the COVID-19 pandemic and not otherwise compensated by insurance or other sources of payment and that such distribution be available to any tribal member who meets the guidelines established in this Resolution;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Tribal Council directs that its Tribal Administrator, Marvin Campbell, establish an application form to document and certify the individual need of Tribal Members requesting payment and distribute such form by mail and internet, and to take such steps as are necessary to implement the relief authorized by this Resolution.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that applications must be received by November 19, 2021 to be eligible for relief;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED,** that the Tribal Council has determined that this distribution shall be exempt from federal income tax by reason of Internal Revenue Code §139 and § 139E, and that this Resolution shall be considered a "written plan" and "specified guidelines" for purposes of §139E.
