RESOLUTION NO. 10-74

of the

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe, its members, its lands, its enterprises and its agencies by the authority of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, under the Constitution, Bylaws and inherent sovereignty of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of the tribal members, and with protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources and rights of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the creation of ordinances and resolutions in order to fulfill their duty of protecting the health, security, education, and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) has announced the availability of funding under the COPS Tribal Methamphetamine Initiative Program 2010 (Tribal Meth) to support enforcement, training and prevention activities to address the growing problem of meth abuse; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Public Safety and Justice Department is dedicated to protecting lives, maintaining peace and ensuring that the property and resources of the Squaxin Island Tribe are protected through the enforcement of Laws and Regulations set forth by the Squaxin Island Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe witnessed the devastation of methamphetamines within the Squaxin community and the negative effect it has placed on the safety and welfare of the tribal community and its children; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Public and Justice Department has experienced an increase in caseloads and calls pertaining to meth activity, placing a higher demand on the level of services needed in order to provide a program suitable to the needs of the community; and

WHEREAS, with the problem of meth continuing to escalate across Indian County including the Squaxin Island Tribe, funding levels have proven to be insufficient to address this problem that has been both devastating and tragic; and


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the submission of a grant application to the U.S. DOJ COPS Meth grant program for up to \$200,000 to establish a comprehensive methamphetamine reduction effort under the Tribe's Public Safety and Justice Department; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the Tribal Chairman, Executive Director, or Deputy Executive Director to be the Tribe's signatory and representative in all future matters requiring Tribal authorization on this particular project; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that these authorities shall be for the duration of the project.
