

RESOLUTION

At a meeting of the tribal council of the Squaxin Island Tribe on the 7th day of Nov, 1955, at which a quorum was present, the following resolution was adopted by a vote of 5 to 0:

WHEREAS, It is advantageous to the purchaser of timber on the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation to know that he will be sure of getting access to and from the Island across the tideland with his equipment and his purchased logs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that application for lease on tidelands floating on allotments sold at public bid sale will be approved at the sum of \$250.00 per sale parcel for a 12-month lease, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the permittee or lessee shall designate one tideland area not to exceed 150 yards in length across which he shall transport his equipment and all the logs he removes.
