WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the creation of ordinances and resolutions in order to fulfill their duty of protecting the health, security, education, and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the requirement of Section 12.41 of Appendix X to those Washington State Tribal-State gaming compacts that are in effect as a matter of federal law under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, and as to which compacts said Appendix X have been appended and become a legally approved, effective and operative part thereof under IGRA; and

WHEREAS, the tribes are parties to such compacts and have adopted a means of transferring compact allocation rights to operate Tribal Lottery Systems Player Terminals between Eligible Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the effective date of this plan is March 19, 2000; and

WHEREAS, this plan shall remain in effect for at least one year from the Effective Date, or until changed by a majority of Eligible Tribes, whichever last occurs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Council does hereby approve this plan and designates Andy Whitener as the Tribal representative and Bruce Johnson as the Alternate under the Terminal Allocation Transfer Plan, to serve on the Steering Committee established as a policy committee authorized to make decisions and provide oversight concerning the Terminal Allocation Transfer Plan.

GAMING DEVICE ALLOCATIONS UNDER TERMINAL ALLOCATION

TRANSFER PLAN

This memorandum is to provide important information about the allocation of gaming devices and the Terminal Allocation Transfer Plan ("Plan") as adopted in compliance with section 12.4.1 of the Tribal-State Compact Appendix X.

Under Appendix X of the tribal-state gaming compact, "acquisitions and transfers of Player Terminals shall be made only pursuant to a plan approved by no less than a majority of the tribes that were Eligible Tribes at the time such plan was adopted" (see Appendix X section 12.4.1). To comply with the Compact requirements, on March 19, 1999, the then-Eligible Tribes (those tribes with gaming compacts that include Appendix X) adopted the Terminal Allocation Transfer Plan ("Plan"). The Plan's Steering Committee is composed of one representative from each Eligible Tribe.

Under the Plan provisions, an annual meeting of the Plan Steering Committee is held each year in June. At the annual meeting, Steering Committee members will elect a Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, as well as take other action necessary and appropriate to oversee the administration of the rules and conditions of the Plan. As Plan Coordinator, I propose the 2000 Steering Committee meeting be held on Friday, June 9, 2000. Please contact me with comments, or business you may wish to include on that meeting agenda.

As of this date, we have red the resolution adopting the Plan and the resolution naming the tribe's Steering Committee representatives from the following tribes: Jamestown

S'Klallam Tribe; Muckleshoot Indian Tribe; Skokomish Tribe; Nooksack Tribe; Tulalip Tribes; Lower Elwha S'Klallam Tribe; and Swinomish Indian Tribal Community.

It thus appears that the two resolutions are now due from: Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe; Upper Skagit Tribe; Chehalis Tribe; Puyallup Tribe; Squaxin Island Tribe; Quileute Tribe; Quinault Tribe; Yakama Indian Nation; Hoh Tribe; Kalispel Tribe; Nisqually Tribe; and Suquamish Tribe.

Please note that all Eligible Tribes must provide a tribal resolution agreeing to be bound by the Plan (see Plan section 9) as well as a resolution designating the tribe's one Steering Committee representative (see Plan section 7.). Each tribe is responsible for ensuring that its designation of a Steering Committee member is accurate and up to date. These resolutions, as well as resolutions to be bound by the Plan as adopted by the Eligible Tribes on March 19, 1999, should be sent to my attention at the above address.

As required under the Annual Eligible Tribe considering transfer of any of its Terminal Allocation Permits or acquiring such Permits from another tribe "shall first send a Notice to the Plan Coordinator indicating its interest in transferring or acquiring Terminal Allocation Permits and the number of permits available or desired." These Permits will be included on a list of Permits available and desired. The list will be updated when necessary, and circulated to the designated representative for each Tribe. Only the Terminal Allocation Permits on that list are available for transfer under the Plan (see Plan section 6.j.).

It is important that the Plan Coordinator maintain a complete and accurate list of the following: Eligible Tribes; the tribe's contact person(s); the tribe's Steering Committee Representative; the tribe's resolution to agree to the Plan; and the number of Terminal Allocation Permits the tribe is interested in making available or acquiring. We request your assistance in providing and updating this information.

WHEREAS, The Tulalip Tribes, has entered into an amendment to its gaming compact with the State of Washington authorizing a Tribal Lottery System ("TLS") and providing for the adoption of a plan by compacted tribes for the transfer of TLS terminal allocations; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tulalip Tribes, that the attached Washington State Lottery System Terminal Allocation Transfer Plan, including attachments thereto (the "Plan") is hereby approved, and the prior vote by the Tribe's Executive Director of Gaming and execution of the Plan on behalf of the Tribe by the Executive Director of Gaming at such meeting, are hereby ratified; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such approved and ratification shall have the same force and effect as if the Plan had been approved by the Board of Directors, and execution of the Plan on behalf of the Tribe authorized by the Board of Directors, prior to adoption of the Plan; and,
