RESOLUTION NO. 05- 12D

of the

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe, its members, its lands, its enterprises and its agencies by the authority of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, under the Constitution, Bylaws and inherent sovereignty of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of the tribal members, and with protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources and rights of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the creation of ordinances and resolutions in order to fulfill their duty of protecting the health, security, education, and general welfare of tribal members, and of protecting and managing the lands and treaty resources of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has announced the availability of FY 2006 grant funds through the Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance to plan, develop, and implement a comprehensive, system-wide strategy to control and prevent alcohol and substance abuse-related crime; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe recognizes the effects of alcohol and substance abuse on tribal community members and is committed to controlling and preventing alcohol and substance abuse crime and providing a safe and secure environment for Squaxin Island Community members.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the submission of a grant application to the Indian Alcohol and Substance Abuse Program for up to \$250,000 over the period of two years for the purpose of controlling and preventing alcohol and drug related crime; **and**

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THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the Tribal Chairman, Executive Director, or Deputy Executive Director to be the Tribe's signatory and representative in all future matters requiring Tribal authorization on this particular project; and

THERFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that these authorities shall be for the duration of the project.
