
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL





WHEREAS it is the object of the Squaxin Island Indian Tribe, of the Squaxin Island Reservation of Washington, as stated in a recent proposal, to promote the advancement and welfare of the Indians of Squaxin Island and to establish and enforce such rules as may be necessary to safeguard Indian property and resources for the use of present and future generations; and

WHEREAS the elected leaders of the Squaxin Island Tribe recognizes their responsibility to plan wisely for the use of the land resources of Squaxin Island for the benefit of Tribal members, now and in the future; and

WHEREAS the Tribal Coordinator and the Planning Commission, assisted by its consultants, are preparing a Comprehensive Plan for the development of Squaxin Island Reservation; and

WHEREAS the Comprehensive Plan is based on careful studies and surveys of the resources of Squaxin Island Reservation and of the problems, needs, and aspirations of the Tribe, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that S.T.O.W.W. Inc. be appointed Administrator of the funds appropriated by BIA to pay salary and other expenses for Squaxin Island Coordinator. (\$11,000) 10%, or \$1100.00 of this money to go to STOWW for Administration.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tribal Council will each year review the Comprehensive Plan and make whatever revisions are necessary to continue to express the intentions of the Tribal Council and the best interests of the Squaxin Island Tribe.
