WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island Tribe in accordance with Article III, section I, of the Tribe's Constitution and ByLaws; and,

WHEREAS, The Council is empowered to manage the Tribal tidelands surrounding Squaxin Island in order to preserve and protect tribal property and to insure that members of the Squaxin Island Tribe have the continued beneficial use of said tribal property all in accordance with Article III, Section I (B), of the Squaxin Island Constitution and ByLaws; and,

WHEREAS, on numerous occasions persons who are not members of the Squaxin Island Tribe have come onto the lands, tidelands and shoreline areas of the Squaxin Island Tribe and have there committed waste, destroyed foliage, removed shellfish and other aquatic life, and have engaged in activities generally disrespectful of the land and the traditions of the Squaxin Island Tribe,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED that the Squaxin Island Tribal Lands, tidelands and shoreline areas, all reserved for the exclusive use of the Squaxin Island Indian Tribe and its members by the Treaty of Medicine Creek be and are hereby closed to all persons not members of the Squaxin Island Indian Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that any person wishing to enter the Squaxin Island Tribal Lands, tidelands, or shoreline areas for any purpose whatsoever shall first make application to the Squaxin Island Tribal Council for a permit at the Squaxin Island business office at Kamilche, Washington. The form of the application for said

permit and the permit shall be determined by the Squaxin Island Tribal Council. The approval or disapproval of any application for such a permit shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council. The Squaxin Island Tribal Council may approve an application for a permit and may impose as part of such approval any conditions, limitations or other considerations deemed appropriate by the Tribal Council. Any action taken by the Tribal Council pursuant to this ordinance shall be final and no appeal shall be allowed.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that it shall be unlawful for any person not a member of the Squaxin Island Tribe to:


1. Come upon any Squaxin Island Tribal Lands, tidelands or shoreline areas without first complying with the procedures established in this ordinance.
2. Go upon any lands, tidelands, or shoreline areas of the Squaxin Island Tribe and thereon collect artifacts, driftwood, souvenirs, gravel, or destroy, deface or in any way injure any historic or prehistoric ruins or monuments, or any object of antiquity situated on such lands, tidelands or shoreline areas without first procuring a permit which specifically allows such activity.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that nothing herein shall limit the right of the United States Government to prosecute any person not a member of the Squaxin Island Tribe for hunting, fishing, trapping, clam digging, or oyster picking on Squaxin Island lands, tidelands or shoreline areas contrary to any provision of federal law. Any person refusing to adhere to leave pursuant to the warning given by a Squaxin Island Law Enforcement officer


shall be subject to prosecution for violation of this ordinance
in the Squaxin Island Tribal Court.


CERTIFICATION
