

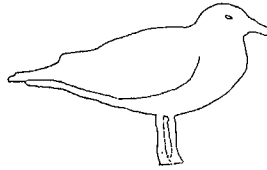

RESOLUTION NO. 76-28 ^B

of the
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation by authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965, and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is desirous of entering into a "Transition Quarter" Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Fisheries Enforcement, and

WHEREAS, at a meeting with Bureau Representatives in Yelm, Washington at the Nisqually Tribal Office, Squaxin Island Representatives were informed that "Transition Quarter" Budgets for Fisheries Enforcement could be geared to one-quarter (1/4) of the FY-76 Contract amount, plus add-on, and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has carefully reviewed the proposed "Transition Quarter" Budget for the Squaxin Island Fisheries Enforcement Program and find that due to other budgetary cut-backs it would be impossible to reduce the amount without severely jeopardizing a developing program, and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is dissatisfied with the existing Bureau of Indian Affairs Enforcement Program as relates to the "Boltd Decision", and

Whereas, the Fisheries Enforcement Program as currently contracted through the Bureau of Indian Affairs is the only means for

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support of a Federal Court Mandate.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize submission on the Squaxin Island Tribal Police Proposal for a Squaxin Island Fisheries Enforcement Contract with the Western Washington Agency of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council insists that should budgetary reductions be required, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Boldt Enforcement be reduced adequately to allow financial commitment for contracting to the Tribes.
