RESOLUTION NO. 80-04 of the SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has the responsibility to protect and manage tribal real property and other tribal assets; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned that persons have taken actions, or threatened to take actions, that cause serious harm to tribal cultural, historical, natural and economic resources; and

WHEREAS, tribal real property includes the tidelands surrounding Squaxin Island, and three Off-Island Reservation areas known as the Hartstine Oyster Company, tribal housing, and tribal administration areas; and

WHEREAS, entry onto the Squaxin Island Reservation is not possible without entry upon tribal real property;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council hereby enacts and promulgates the attached Exclusion Ordinance so that it may protect the resources of the Tribe; PROVIDED, that tribal members may not be excluded from the Reservation, and owners of nontrust land may not be excluded from the land they own.

## CERTIFICATION

The Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby certify that the above Resolution was adopted at a regular meeting of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council held on this 9<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1980, at which time a quorum was present and passed by a vote of 3 for, o against.
