> WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965;

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with the protection of its Tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council feels the need to provide a Defense Attorney to represent tribal members in court; and

WHEREAS, the court fine monies, held in the "Law Enforcement Special Funds" are available to court needs.

NOWTHEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council hereby employs Carlos delos Santos to act as Defense Attorney, with the aid of one tribal advocate, in our Tribal Court as the need arises and unless otherwise resolved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council adopts the attached Budget for the hiring of Defense Attorney, Carlos delos Santos.
