RESOLUTION NO. 86-7

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July, 1965; and

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council has the responsibility to care for and protect the members of the Tribal Community, the Council has enacted a Law and Order Code to do so, on January 16, 1980; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council deems it necessary to amend the Law and Order Code in order to carry out that responsibility in the best possible manner.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does here-by amend the Squaxin Island Law and Order Code as set forth in the attached:

LAW AND ORDER CODE P. 58-59

PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

21. LIQUOR

21.2 Illegal Sale, Purchase, Possession of Liquor; Illegal Transfer or Use of I.D.

Repeal: ~~(2) No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall purchase or possess any liquor.~~

New

Section: 21.3 Minor in Possession of Liquor.

(1) No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall purchase, possess, consume, obtain, or sell any liquor.

(2) "Consume" includes both the act of consuming and the condition of having consumed liquor.

(3) Any violation of this section shall be punishable by:

(a) Community Service Hours not to exceed 100 hours;

(b) A fine not to exceed \$100.00; or both, and

(c) Such other disposition which may be proposed by the Tribe or the defendant, consistent with section 33.4, and which the Court deems just.

COMMENT: The Law and Order Code had possession and purchase of liquor by a minor as a gross misdemeanor.* The proposed section expands the definition of the crime and makes the sentence more appropriate for juveniles.

*Maximum 4 months jail and \$500 fine.
