RESOLUTION NO. 87-8  
of the  
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has the responsibility to care for and protect the members of the Tribal Community. On January 16, 1980 the Tribal Council enacted the Law and Order Code; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council deems it necessary to assure that the Squaxin Island Youth obtain an adequate education.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby adopt the civil truancy ordinance as follows:

### Squaxin Island Civil Truancy Ordinance Failure to Attend School (See Truancy Policy & Procedures)

- 1) Any child over the age of seven and under the age of sixteen, who has not completed the ninth (9th) grade, and who has shown failure to attend school shall be guilty of an offense.
- 2) Violation of this section shall be punishable by:
  - a. Community service not to exceed 100 hours; or
  - b. A fine not to exceed \$100

### Section 31.

#### DEFERRED PROSECUTION (proposed Amendments Underlined):

- 1) The Tribal Prosecutor may enter a deferred prosecution agreement with a person charged for the first time with a misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor, fishing violation, or liquor violation committed by a minor, where no violence occurred in connection with the offense.


#### 31.2 DEFERRED PROSECUTION: OFFENSES CAUSED BY ALCOHOL OR DRUG ABUSE.


- 1) A person charged with misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor, or liquor violation committed by a minor may request the Tribal Court to be considered for a deferred prosecution program under this subsection.
- 2) An assessment, evaluation or diagnosis of the person's alcohol or drug problems.


