# RESOLUTION NO. 8:8-3 of the SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted to provide for the social, health and economic well-being of the Squaxin Island Tribal Citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is responsible for managing it's tribal fishery; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council believes that the implementation of the U.S. Canada Salmon Interception Treaty is vital to the protection of this important resource; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is familiar with the procedures by which Tribal Representatives are nominated for positions on the Pacific Salmon Commission and Regional Panels, and believes those procedures are appropriate.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council hereby endorces James Peters for the position of Pacific Salmon Treaty Allocation delegate for Squuxin Island Tribe.

### CERTIFICATION



RESOLUTION NO. 88-3
of the
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe participates in management of fish and shellfish, their habitat, and other natural resource values in the Tribe's usual and accustomed area; and

WHEREAS, non-point pollution represents a threat to the natural resources of this area; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Department of Ecology is implementing a non-point pollution control program which will include management activities on several watersheds within the Tribe's usual and accustomed area; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Department of Ecology is making funds available to Tribes through the Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission to facilitate participation in these watershed management activities; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is in the best interests of the Medicine Creek Treaty Tribes to jointly secure funding for participation in this program;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council agrees to enter into an agreement with the other Medicine Creek Tribes, the Puyallup Tribe and the Nisqually Tribe, to secure funding from the Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council agrees to act as the lead Tribe for the purposes of signing a contract with the Northwest Indian Fisheries Commission.
