RESOLUTION NO. 89- 23 of the SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has determined that the membership and people in the Squaxin Community require programs and services which meet their cultural, health, educational, informational, and recreational needs; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Tribal Membership and service area Indians suffer a 54% unemployment rate due to the lack of adequate skills and education to qualify for consistent employment; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe experiences a 59% Indian student dropout rate from the local public schools beginning at the junior high school level of 7th and 8th Grades; and

WHEREAS, the combination of both a high drop-out rate from school results in the high unemployment rate due to the lack of marketable work skills and education of the tribal members and services area for the tribe; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Tribe does hereby make application to the Washington State Vocational Education-J.T.P.A. Program to provide training, education, and employment for qualified participants to worka in the Tribal Enterprise Oyster Facility and the Tribal Fisheries Division with JTPA providing 50% of the costs and the Squaxin Tribe providing 50% of the costs to operate this important project for the Tribe; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Tribal Council is compelled to agree that Indian Unemployment rates are consistently higher then those of the dominent society and JTPA provides the Tribe with the opportunity to effectively these employment deficiencies address currently being experienced by the Tribal service area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the Tribal Chairman, Vice-Chairman, or Tribal Administrative



1. New Year's Day 2. Spring Holiday 3. American Indian Day 4. Memorial Day 5. Independence Day 6. Labor Day 7. Thanksgiving Day 8. Christmas Day

January 1st Friday before Easter May 13th Last Monday in May July 4th First Monday in September 4th Thursday and Friday in November Normally begining December 24th through December 31st
