RESOLUTION NO. 91-27 of the SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, under the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, and general welfare of the Squaxin Island Tribal Reservation residents; and,

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council in the interest of improving the living conditions and quality of life for members of the Squaxin Island Tribe joined with the Nisqually Tribe, the Skokomish Tribe, and the Shoalwater Bay Tribe to form the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority; and,

WHEREAS, there are twenty (20) units of new housing currently under construction on the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation at Klah-Che-Min Village; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has become aware that conditions exist within the area of new housing that are unsafe and may result in the manufacture of substandard housing for the residents of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation - Klah-Che-Min Village; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has authorized William Brown to act in the capacity of Technical Advisor to the Squaxin Island Tribe in matters of construction; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has determined that a meeting should occur between their Technical Advisor William Brown and the architect and engineering staff person who is assigned to the new construction project at the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation - Klah-Che-Min Village to resolve the issues that concern the Squaxin Island Tribal Council; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has determined that such consultations should occur within 24 hours of notification, should such concerns arise in the future.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED The Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby direct the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority to make the architect and engineering staff person assigned to the new construction currently underway on the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation - Klah-Che-Min Village, available to meet with Mr. William Brown, Squaxin TA, on Monday May 6, 1991 at the offices of the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority to work with Mr. Brown until the concerns of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council are satisfactorily resolved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby direct the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority to make the architect and engineering staff person assigned to the new construction at Squaxin, to be available for such consultations within 24 hours should additional concerns arise in the future.


