RESOLUTION NO. 91-28
of the
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, under the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, and general welfare of the Squaxin Island Tribal Reservation residents; and,

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council in the interest of improving the living conditions and quality of life for members of the Squaxin Island Tribe joined with the Nisqually Tribe, the Skokomish Tribe, and the Shoalwater Bay Tribe to form the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has made known the fact that they have concerns relative to the standards of that are being employed in the construction of the twenty (20) new housing units on the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation at Klah-Che-Min Village; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has directed there be a meeting of the architect and engineering staff person assigned to work at the Squaxin Island new construction site and the Technical Advisor delegated by the Tribal Council to resolve those concerns; and,

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has determined that should the required meeting not occur or should the issues at hand not be satisfactorily resolved, now or in the future, that construction which might result in substandard housing should not continue.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby decree that the South Puget Sound Intertribal Housing Authority shall stop work on the twenty (20) units of new housing currently under construction at 4:00 p.m., Monday, May 6, 1991 should the requested meeting not occur or should there be no satisfactory resolution to the concerns of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council.
