



## SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBE

**RESOLUTION NO. 91-65  
OF THE  
SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted to provide for the social, health, and economic well-being of the Tribe and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has prioritized the strengthening and expansion of secondary and post secondary educational services for tribal youth as the number one priority; and

WHEREAS, many Squaxin Island Indian youth do not have the opportunity to access career counseling and advocacy support services; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council recognizes that there is a need to prepare and support Native American high school students for post-secondary educational efforts; and

WHEREAS, Native American youth in Mason County, Washington, are not eligible to participate in the current Evergreen State College Upward Bound Program activities.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council supports the submittal of a grant to the Department of Education by Evergreen State College for continuing and expanding the Upward Bound program to include Native American youth in Mason County.
