RESOLUTION NO. 93- 17
of the

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and,

WHEREAS, under the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, and general welfare of the Squaxin Island Tribal Reservation residents; and,

WHEREAS, The Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been advised of the availability of FY 1993 funding through the National Endowment for the Humanities, for projects designed to increase public understanding of the humanities.

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe intends to develop programs which will enhance the community's knowledge of their personal history and traditions,


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the development and the submission of a proposal on behalf of the Squaxin Island Tribe to NEH to initiate a twelve month canoe building project which will involve education and hands-on experiences for the entire community as well as people from around the region including other tribal communities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the Tribal Chairman or the Tribal Administrative Director to be the Tribe's representative in all future matters requiring Tribal authorization on this particular project; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these authorities shall be for the duration of this project.

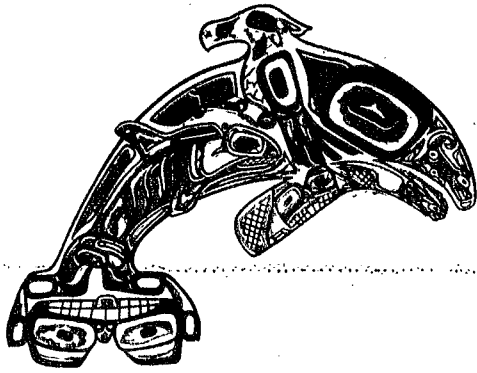

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the Constitution and By-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted to provide for the social, health, and economic well-being of the Tribe and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe is rich in history, culture, tradition and heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has recognized that protection, preservation of history, culture, tradition and heritage are necessary to ensure the survival of the Squaxin Island Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe has a desire to promote cultural education through a traditional canoe building project; and

WHEREAS, The National Park Service has funds available to promote cultural education through the sharing of oral traditions, dances, songs, subsistence activities, and other traditional lifeways among generations within tribal communities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby approve the submission of an application to the National Park Service to promote cultural education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the Tribal Chairman or the Tribal Coordinating Director to sign and administer the Contract.


