RESOLUTION NO. 93-40

OF THE SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation by authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with conducting the business of the Squaxin Island Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted to provide for the social, health and economic well being of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council finds it necessary and appropriate to address the problem of Truancy within our community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby adopt the attached Truancy Policy and Procedure dated February 11, 1993.

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TRUANCY POLICY AND PROCEDURE FEBRUARY 11, 1993

This policy, dated February 11, 1993 and adopted by the Tribal Council shall supercede any and all Truancy Policy and Procedures, in effect prior to this date.


The Indian Child Welfare Office and Enforcement Department of the Squaxin Island Tribe shall, upon notification by the school of two or more unexcused absences of any student, follow the procedures listed herein.

PROCEDURES FOR INTERVENTION IN MATTERS OF TRUANCY

- 1. After two unexcused absences, the school shall notify the Indian Child Welfare (ICW) office of the Tribe.
- 2. The ICW office will contact in writing, the parent/guardian and request a response within five (5) working days.
- 3. If response is not received within five (5) working days, or additional absences have since occurred, the ICW office will make a home visit to resolve the problem with the parent/guardian.
- 4. In the event of five (5) unexcused absences within one school year, the ICW office will notify the Tribal Law Enforcement.
- 5. The first time a child's case is referred to Law Enforcement, the truant child shall be charged with Failure to Attend School.
- 6. Subsequent truancies shall result in charging the child with Failure to Attend School and charging the parent/guardian with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

In the case of any child under the age of twelve (12) years, citations will be issued to the parent/guardian. In the case of any child twelve (12) years or older, the citation will be issued to the child.

In any case involving Failure to Attend School, both the truant child and parent/guardian shall be called into court.



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CERTIFICATION
