RESOLUTION NO. 93-45 OF THE SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation by authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has been entrusted with conducting the business of the Squaxin Island Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe is a successor to certain reserved fishing rights secured in the Medicine Creek Treaty; and

WHEREAS, the United States and its agencies have a trust responsibility to secure said rights; and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency has found that certain fish taken from certain locations in the Puget Sound may be contaminated with dioxins, trace metals, PCBs and pesticides; and

WHEREAS, these contaminated fish may present a health risk to Native Americans engaged in exercising treaty fishing rights or in utilizing fish taken under the treaty fishing right depending upon the amount and type of fish consumed; and

WHEREAS, no accurate survey of Native American fish consumption exists on which to base an assessment of health risk for Squaxin Island tribal members;

WHEREAS, a fish consumption survey is currently being organized which will assist tribal governments in safeguarding the health of tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe is one of two tribes selected to participate in an EPA-funded, pilot Fish Consumption Survey,


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribe accepts the invitation to participate in the pilot Fish Consumption Survey to assess health risks to tribal members from the consumption of contaminated fish;

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribe is one of two tribes selected to participate in an EPA-funded, pilot Fish Consumption Survey,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribe accepts the invitation to participate in the pilot Fish Consumption Survey to assess health risks to tribal members from the consumption of contaminated fish;
