WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island tribe of Indians by the authority of the constitution and by-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has adopted the Squaxin Island fishing Ordinance, Resolution No. 81-55 and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds it necessary and appropriate to amend the Fishing Ordinance for the purpose of managing and protecting the Tribal resource.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby amend the Squaxin Island Fishing Ordinance as set forth in the attachment.

As per Resolution No. 94-111 adopted on September 22, 1994 add the following to page 40 section 3.16.060 of the shellfish codes.

- (e) A tribal member who has a physical impairment that constitutes or results in a substantial impediment to participating in the treaty reserved right to harvest shellfish may apply to the Tribal Council for either a short or long term disability assistance permit.
  - (1) The application must be accompanied by documentation from a licensed medical doctor, which must include: description of disability, limitations, restrictions and duration expectations of disability.
  - (2) Upon approval, Tribal Council will authorize Squaxin Island Natural Resources Department to issue an assistance permit to the assistant.
  - (3) Assistance may be generated from, a spouse or other family member.
  - (4) The person receiving assistance and the assistance provider must both be present at the beach and have valid permits during the harvest.
  - (5) Tribal council may also designate areas for disabled harvesters.
