OF THE

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation by authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and


WHEREAS, under the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of tribal members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has determined that a Brush Picking Ordinance was generated and set in motion on April 15, 1984, and recognizes that a Resolution adopting that Ordinance cannot be located in the records of the Tribe; and


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council does hereby approve and adopt this ordinance governing the picking of brush for commercial purposes on Squaxin Island Reservation.



**PERMIT TO ENTER AND PICK BRUSH
ON THE
SQUAXIN ISLAND INDIAN RESERVATION**

_____ has the permission of the Squaxin Island Tribal Council to enter the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation and/or cross Tribal tidelands for the express purpose of picking brush for commercial purposes.

All brush picking activities will comply with the Brush Picking Ordinance and will be conducted only in those areas indicated on the attached map.

This permit is valid for one year.

The following spouse and children under 16 years of age should be included under this permit.

By issuance of this permit, it shall be deemed you have consented to the exercise of jurisdiction by the Squaxin Island tribal Court over said person or entity in legal actions arising pursuant to the Tribal Law and Order Ordinances.

BRUSH PICKING ORDINANCE

1. Effective Date: This ordinance shall take effect April 15, 1984.
2. Territory: This ordinance governs the picking of brush for commercial purposes on tribally owned lands on the Squaxin Island Reservation. A map is attached that indicates which portions of Squaxin Island are available for brush picking. All other areas are closed to brush picking without written permission from the owner and a permit to cross tidelands from the Tribal Council.
3. Tribal Member Only: Only Tribal members may pick brush on the reservation, except for a spouse and children when the member is present and engaged in brush picking activities. No other non-Tribal members may assist in any way in brush picking.
4. Permits: All Tribal members wishing to pick brush commercially must have a permit. Any Tribal member may apply for a permit. Spouses and children under 16 years old may be included on the permit.
 - 4.1 Permits will be issued by the Natural Resources Department for a period of one year from date of issuance.
 - 4.2 The original permit shall be retained on file by the Natural Resources Department. One copy will be submitted to Law Enforcement. One copy will be held by the permittee and must be in his/her possession when picking brush.
 - 4.3 A copy of this ordinance shall be attached to each permit issued.
5. Permit Fees: There will be a fee of \$25.00 required for a brush picking permit for an individual Tribal member. If the spouse is included on the permit then the fee shall be \$50.00
6. Techniques: No mechanized equipment shall be used. Other requirements may be imposed by the Natural Resources Department and will be set out in the permit.
7. Non-compliance: Failure to comply with any of the sections of this ordinance will be considered a violation and penalties will be imposed.

8. Penalties: The following penalties will be imposed for violations.
 - 7.1 Confiscation of brush found in possession at the time of the violation.
 - 7.2 The permit shall be revoked. No new permit will be issued for one year.
 - 7.3 The violator shall be subject upon conviction in a civil trial in Tribal Court to a civil penalty of \$250.00.
