RESOLUTION NO. 8-53

SQUAXIN ISLAND TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the governing body of the Squaxin Island Tribe of Indians by the authority of the constitution and by-laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council has the authority to promulgate laws and ordinances for the protection and well-being of the Tribe and it's members, and

WHEREAS, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council finds it necessary and appropriate to authorize by resolution to add to the Civil/Traffic Code, Section 8.01, Opening or consuming liquor in Public Place, and 8.02, Intoxication in a Public Place and finds that the above additions will be beneficial to the safety and welfare of the Squaxin Island Tribal Community;


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council hereby amends the Squaxin Island Tribal Civil/Traffic Code as set forth in the attached draft, effective the 22nd day of June, 1995.

CHAPTER 8 - CIVIL/TRAFFIC/LIQUOR

8.01      OPENING OR CONSUMING LIQUOR IN PUBLIC PLACE

No person shall open the package containing liquor or consume liquor in a public place.

8.02      INTOXICATION IN A PUBLIC PLACE

No person who is intoxicated shall be or remain in any public place.

PUBLIC PLACE IS DEFINED AS: Any place to which the general public has unrestricted access or any property owned by the Squaxin Island Tribe, which includes being in the public view, but not including inside of private dwellings or buildings.
