**WHEREAS**, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is the Governing Body of the Squaxin Island Indian Reservation by authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Squaxin Island Tribe, as approved and adopted by the General Body and the Secretary of the Interior on July 8, 1965; **and**

**WHEREAS**, under the Constitution and By-laws of the Tribe, the Squaxin Island Tribal Council is charged with the duty of protecting the health, security, education and general welfare of tribal members; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the Tribe has been a member of the South Puget Intertribal Planning Agency (SPIPA) since its inception in 1976; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the Squaxin Tribe presently operates a Family Violence Prevention and Services program designed to address family violence issues within the community; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the Tribe is advised of the availability of continued funding for FY-96 through the Department of Health and Human Services for the Family Violence Prevention and Services Program.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Squaxin Island Tribal Council does hereby authorize the South Puget Intertribal Planning Agency to prepare, submit, negotiate, execute, and administer, with the Department of Health and Human Services, a grant proposal and agreement and any amendments thereto, for an FY-96 Family Violence Prevention and Services Program on behalf of the Squaxin Island Tribal Community.

It is time again to apply for Family Violence dollars. If your tribe is interested in continuing this program through DHHS, please submit a new resolution for fiscal year 1996. I have attached last year's resolution for reference.

Typically, these monies are used for the following activities:

- \* Provide emergency shelter at a safe house away from violent domestic situations.
- \* Provide temporary shelter when safe houses do not have space available.
- \* Transportation to and from a safe house.
- \* Emergency items such as food, change of clothing, diapers, personal hygiene items, temporary childcare.
- \* Violence prevention counseling for abusers/families.
- \* Outreach, parenting training, family enrichment.
- \* Vocational training for battered spouse.
- \* Staff salaries and fringe (up to 30 percent only).
- \* Support and technical assistance for victims to gain access to civil and criminal courts and community services.

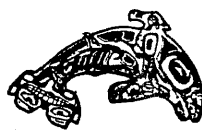

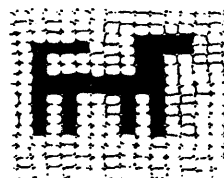

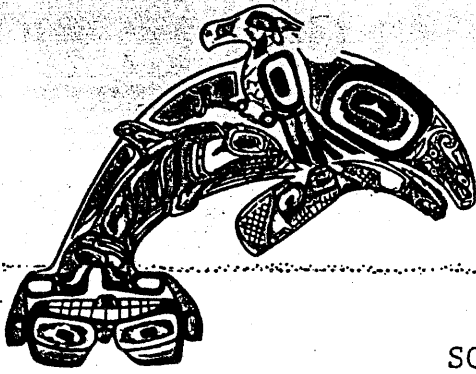
