FAFSA Update and Delays

The Department of Education (DOE) released the longanticipated new FAFSA website on January 2nd. Due to technical issues common with new websites of this scale, the site has only been accessible for an hour or two each day. This is causing delays and frustration for students and families attempting to access the FAFSA site. The DOE is advising applicants to remain patient as final adjustments to the system

Meet Wyatt, a Free Digital FAFSA Assistant

A free, online digital adviser designed to help students and families apply for the FAFSA is now available. The app is called Wyatt, and to date, has helped over 30,000 students complete the FAFSA and secure over \$40 million in federal grant aid. "Wyatt is a scalable solution to help more students, especially students from low-income backgrounds and first-generation college applicants, navigate the FAFSA and secure college

Kids Who Read for Pleasure Grow into Better Adjusted Teens

A recent study suggests that old-fashioned book-reading may help children grow into better adjusted middle schoolers. Potential benefits include enhanced memory, speech development, and self-esteem. The study also showed a decrease in behavioral problems and depression. "Reading isn't just a pleasurable experience, it's widely accepted that it inspires thinking and creativity, increases empathy and reduces
